As previously mentioned from last year, many Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (ANCs) simply do not update statutorily required data and documents on their websites or with the Office of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (OANC). Whereupon, many requestors unnecessarily use the FOIA process to request public documents.

OANC is solely mandated to assist and aid ANCs, in accordance with DC Official Code section 1-309.15(a), and is legislatively tied from mandating legal requirements upon ANCs. As a result, requestors believe that the affected ANCs are not exemplifying

transparency. At the same time, requestors fail to narrow the terms needed for ANC document reviews to obtain the desired records.

FYI, each of the 11 denied requests were explained on the bases of “overly broad,” “lacking in specificity,” or “not in compliance with 1 DCMR section 402.4.

The number of FOIA requests received by the Council has also relatively stabilized, but the requests themselves continue to be expansive, both in terms of the subject matter and the number of locations to be searched for responsive records. Many requests generated large search results that numbered in the thousands of responsive documents, which required a great deal of staff time to review and process and required coordination with multiple, and many times all, of the Councilmembers’ offices to ensure that reasonable efforts were made to search for the requested records.**

The District of Columbia Housing Authority (DCHA) Annual Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Report contains detailed summary statistics of the activities conducted in the administration of FOIA including the number of requests received and processed by the agency. Some requests were not granted because they did not reasonably describe requested records; sought responses to questions in lieu of records or documents that would be subject to release under FOIA; or the agency had no responsive records at all.



## District of Columbia Housing Authority

During the fiscal year, the District of Columbia Housing Authority's (DCHA) Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Team devoted fifteen hundred (1,500) hours to responding to FOIA requests and appeals from requesters. This does not reflect the work hours performed by agency record custodians throughout DCHA or the human capital associated with gathering the documents that were responsive to FOIA requests. During the fiscal year, fifty-five percent (55%) of the FOIA requests received were from three newspaper reporters. Sixty-nine percent (69%) of the appeals DCHA responded to during the fiscal year were from newspaper reporters. None of the appeals resulted in any adverse decisions against the agency.

Most of these appeals sought Personally Identifiable Information (PII) of DCHA applicants, residents, and Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCVP) participants. Most FOIA requests to DCHA seek records that are related to the agency's housing programs and subsequently result in records that include the PII of individuals who are the recipients of housing assistance from the agency. As such DCHA recognizes its role in protecting the Personal Data or PII of housing program applicants, public housing residents, and HCVP participants and therefore relies upon Exception 2 of the DC FOIA Act to protect the PII of subsidy recipients. DCHA is also concerned about the overall, security, privacy rights, and well-being of all the people it serves and is committed to affirmatively furthering fair housing by championing HUD's goal to eliminate the stigma of those who utilize a housing subsidy. DCHA also appreciates the important role FOIA plays in keeping the government transparent and accountable.

## **QUALITATIVE DESCRIPTION OR SUMMARY STATEMENT – DCPS ANNUAL FOIA REPORT FY 2022**

DCPS processed 125 FOIA requests in FY 22. DCPS continues to process a considerable number of voluminous and complex requests, involving large email searches, documents, and data. A sizable number of these FOIA requests come from media entities, including NBC Washington, The Washington Post, Fox News Digital and WJLA. DCPS has continued to maintain efficiency with the completion of requests by utilizing all available human capital resources, including one team member whose sole purpose is opening new requests, sending acknowledgment letters, and responding to requests that are able to be closed immediately (if the FOIA request is improper or the request must be filed with another agency). The FOIA team also continued to engage DCPS employees who serve as POCs for FOIA requests. This engagement includes meetings to discuss complicated or voluminous requests and discussions to clarify the responsibility of agency staff in performing searches to respond to requests. The FOIA team continues to be proactive in providing requesters with periodic updates on the status of requests and in contacting requesters to obtain clarity on requests when necessary.

DCPS continues to implement a fee schedule. However, the majority of the requests DCPS receives are from the media, so the opportunity to collect fees is limited. DCPS collected \$96.00 in fees in FY 22 for two FOIA requests. DCPS also assessed \$96.00 in fees for FY 2021 that remain delinquent. To help resolve the issue with delinquent fees, DCPS has adjusted its process so that requesters are sent notifications informing them that their responses are complete, along with a fee Invoice. The request is then placed on hold to allow the requester to remit payment and responses are released once payment is received. DCPS maintains a list of delinquent requesters and requires advance payment for future FOIA requests in accordance with applicable law.

Although there were several large FOIA requests in that consumed inordinate amounts of processing time, DCPS processed the majority of the requests received in FY 22 within the statutorily prescribed time limits. DCPS will continue to improve the ways in which resources are expended to achieve timely processing of all FOIA requests.

During the first 6 months of 2022, DDOT received an extraordinary number of requests for e-mail communications pertaining to several big DDOT infrastructure projects and public incidents that affected the District infrastructure. Media organizations and community groups made numerous requests that required multiple requests to OCTO for internal and external communications. These requests, in particular, generated large data files from OCTO which challenged the team with reviewing and forwarding requests in a timely manner. Meanwhile, DDOT worked hard to remain responsive to the many other FOIA requests and we accomplished this goal in an exemplary manner. We also remained in communication with the requesters which generated many positive responses from our constituents.

Under the Exemptions section, many of DHS’ exemptions fall under § 2-534(a)(2), the personal privacy exemption, and § 2-534(a)(6)(A), the statutory exemption. For DHS personal privacy usually is connected to the confidentiality provisions of the Homeless Services Reform Act of 2005, as amended. That is why the numbers are duplicative for these two exemptions. As seems to be the case annually, DHS’ response times are skewed by four large FOIA requests, one of which required the review of over 14,000 emails for privilege. Additionally, for FOIA requests related to the Homeless Services Program, DHS has a three-level review process to ensure DHS customers’ personal information is protected. Lastly, because most FOIA requests submitted to DHS are from indigent

individuals or requesters who operate in the public interest, such as homeless or public assistance advocacy groups, DHS usually waives its FOIA processing fees.

**From Hannah Brubach:** I took on the role of FOIA Officer beginning in the fourth quarter of the FY 2022. Prior to Q4, David Dickman, DOEE’s General Counsel, acted as the FOIA Officer. Our Staff Assistant, Myra Campbell processes the majority of FOIA requests for the agency. Myra has diligently worked to process a large backlog of requests received by DOEE during the height of the pandemic. At the same time, we are working to reduce the timelines of new requests received.

- *Open requests:* To note, 5 of the 403 open requests are on hold. Only 64 of the 403 remaining open requests were made during FY 2022. Since the close of FY 2022, we have reduced the number of open requests from 403 to 221 (not including requests received in FY 2023).
- *Response time:* Over FY 2022, DOEE reduced our average response time from 422 days to 346 days, and our median response time from 405 days to 265.5 days. DOEE has responded to sixty-three percent (63%) of our FY 2022 requests in 25 or less days.
- *“Other dispositions” includes:* No records (282), Fee Related Reason (1), Requested Records not Reasonably Described (1), Not Agency Record (1), and Duplicate Request (18).

**From Myra Campbell:** This FY has been the most successful, the numbers prove it. Many of old (pre-FY20) requests were finally handled. Some still exist but our numbers reflect the hard work rendered to normalize our FOIA requests workload. This was done by performing countless reviews of inventory (open requests). Some examples include

1. Reaching out to requesters to learn if they were still in need of some requests.
2. Resending documents in order to eliminate requests from queue, sometimes it could be one (1) undeliverable page amongst 2000....located & delivered docs in increments, resulting in successful & closings.
3. Search specific requesters, located duplicates, corresponded and explained processing policies, closed duplicates.
4. Released countless reports to RFD responders (weekly & quarterly) to keep staff on track.
5. Researched requests that had maybe one (1) RFD pending, reviewed request's description to see if the RFD was necessary, placed mistakenly, eligible for deletion, etc.

These are some of the directives I created and followed to reduce our pending requests total. It was successful, resulting in over 1700 closings.

During this fiscal year, the DOES FOIA Officer, who is the General Counsel, was supported by an administrative assistant, a paralegal and a line attorney to process the numerous FOIA requests received. The processing of FOIA requests involved (1) at least 10 email searches from OCTO and the required review and redaction of confidential or otherwise unresponsive information; (2) review and redaction of confidential or otherwise unresponsive information from documents produced by program in response to FOIA requests; (3) frequent and regular interchanges with program to get responsive documents; and (4) frequent and regular interchanges with requesters, who did not understand that DOES is not required to answer questions or create things that do not exist or that have been destroyed, pursuant to the document retention schedule or transferred to the federal government, based on a recall of the function from DOES. Additionally, it is difficult to manage any fees that are received for processing of FOIA request as these funds are not going directly to the agency. Given these circumstances there is likely a revision of the FOIA statute in order to more fully reflect the current electronic documents that must be processed and sorted. The FOIA statute was created in an era of “filed”**

**documents. Now every document may have electronic duplicates and triplicates that must be reviewed and sorted. The fact that all of this must still be done under the old time frame of 15 working days is not really realistic for today's current era.**

The majority of HSEMA's FOIA requests continue to be requests for video from the District Department of Transportation's closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras. Since CCTV footage was automatically cleared 10 days after the date of capture, prior to June 15, 2022, and many requests for this footage came later than 10 days after the event, "no responsive record" is the disposition for the majority of our requests. Additionally, HSEMA received 15 requests related to the January 6 incident at the Capitol in FY21. Due to complexity, sensitivity, and volume, these requests were not able to be processed

within FY21. Records pertaining to these requests were pulled and reviewed in coordination with the Executive Office of the Mayor/Office of the General Counsel and closed in FY22.

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<b>QUALITATIVE DESCRIPTION OR SUMMARY STATEMENT</b>
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For Fiscal Year (FY) 2022, the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) received a total of 2084 FOIAs and BWCs requests, which is an increase of 18% from the FY21. Despite this increase, MPD's median processing time for simple requests decreased from 19 days to 4 days, and from 46 days to 15 days for complex requests. MPD successfully closed 1953 requests of the 2084 request received representing a completion rate of 93% within the 25 days allotted under the FOIA statute.

Due to the increase in the number of complexity of requests for various reports and email records, it required a longer processing time for requests. MPD produces these times of requests on a rolling basis and closes them once all responsive records are released. The most common exemption applied to FOIA requests were those of personal privacy, and open ongoing investigations. The most common exemption applied to BWC requests dealt with personal privacy.

Instead, per the Office of Open Government’s *Guidance for Correspondence with D.C. FOIA Requesters* (8/9/2022), we direct the requester to submit a request with the relevant agency. To the extent that the numbers to our report seem off by 1, there is a FOIA request that has been on-hold since April 2021 because the requester has not perfected their request. ## **FY 2022 FOIA Appeal Summaries**

### **Mayor's Office of Legal Counsel**

**2020-142 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-147 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of PERB to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-159 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of OHR to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-164 Louria:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DGS to a request for a copy of the contract awarded pursuant to the Request for Proposals for Solicitation Number DCAM-20-AE-RFP-0002. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DGS.

**2020-173 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCBOE to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-179 Cloar:** The appeal challenged the response of OTR to a request for records related to the processes used by OTR to produce the Tax Year 2021 real property tax assessments for residential properties. OTR had determined the request was unduly burdensome and did not reasonably describe the records sought. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OTR to conduct an adequate search for the documents sought.

**2020-186 Endress:** The appeal challenged the response of DGS to a request for records related to the construction or repairs to the DC 2 Rocketship Charter School. DGS had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because DGS conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2020-187 Davis-Smith:** The appeal challenged the response of DCPS to a request for incident specific witness statements and a copy of the investigative process when reviewing and documenting incidents related to school safety. DCPS had provided a copy of the DCPS School Barring Procedures and a copy of an incident reports with names redacted pursuant to the FOIA personal privacy exemption, D.C. Code §2-534(a)(2). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the redacted information would be relevant to DCPS's conduct as an agency.

**2020-188; 2020-195 Koepke:** The appeal challenged MPD's failure to respond to a request for records related to mobile device forensic tools. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2020-190 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-191 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCHR to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. DCHR provided documents related to Initiative 71 and Public Employee Salary Information but denied the remainder of the request. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-192 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of ABRA to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-194 Ryals:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for documents related to officers who appear on a “Brady”, “Lewis” or “Giglio” list. MPD had issued a final response stating it did not collect, retain, control or serve as the custodian for this type of record. The appeal was denied as MPD’s interpretation and processing of the request was reasonable.

**2020-200 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of CJCC to a request referencing CJCC and several other institutions in Washington, D.C. CJCC had requested clarification of the request, which it did not receive. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-202 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of OPC to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-203 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DMPSJ to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-204 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DMPSJ to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-205 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DBH to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-206 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of CFSA to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-210 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCHR to the submission of a grievance form referencing a FOIA request. DCHR had denied the grievance as a FOIA request is not a matter subject to review under the grievance process. The appeal was denied for a lack of jurisdiction.

**2020-211 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of PERB to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-212 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DBH to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-216 Johnson:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for documents associated with “Arrest Citation #0117469.” MPD had provided a copy of the responsive documents located with redactions made pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C) “to protect names and other identifying information of witnesses, some MPD personnel and third-party individuals.” The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the redacted information would be relevant to MPD’s conduct as an agency.

**2020-218 Dechon:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for certain police reports related to incidents at 4201 Massachusetts Ave., NW, in Washington, D.C. The appeal was denied because it did not contain a copy of the original request or the response of MPD; this Office was unable to determine the adequacy of the response, or lack thereof.

**2020-220 Taglieri:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for photographs of a specific motor vehicle accident. MPD had denied the request because, “[a]bsent authorization and/or waiver, a release of such records would constitute...a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C).” The requestor provided a signed release in the appeal and the matter was remanded to MPD to promptly disclose the requested records.

**2020-224 Bamidele:** The appeal challenged the response of DDOT to a request seeking answers to a series of questions and for the results of any requests for proposals and contracts related to the administration of certain employee benefit programs. DDOT had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied for a lack of any factual evidence that the records exist; speculation, unsupported by any factual evidence, that records exist is not enough to support a finding that full disclosure has not been made.



**2020-226 Yanevskyy:** The appeal challenged the response of DOC to a request for information about a detainee at the D.C. Central Detention Agency. DOC had denied the request citing the personal privacy exemption to FOIA, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to DOC's conduct as an agency.

**2020-228 Moore:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for any records related to the arrest, incarceration or use as an informant of a specific individual. MPD had denied the request because, "[a]bsent authorization and/or waiver, a release of such records would constitute...a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C)." The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to MPD's conduct as an agency.

**2020-229 Van Vuren:** The appeal challenged the response of DGS to a request for records related to the testing of playgrounds and athletic fields on DCPS school grounds. DGS had issued a final response which provided some records and also stated that it did not have any responsive records for other parts of the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DGS to conduct an adequate search for the documents sought.

**2020-230 Smith:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for any records related to the filing of a missing persons report and the subject of that report. MPD had denied the request because, "[a]bsent authorization and/or waiver, a release of such records would constitute...a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C)." The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to MPD's conduct as an agency.

**2020-231 Khatri:** The appeal challenged UDC's failure to respond to a request for records related to the appointment of certain individuals. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to UDC to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2020-232 Jalloh:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a FOIA request. The appeal was denied because it did not contain a copy of the original request or the response of MPD; this Office was unable to determine the adequacy of the response, or lack thereof.

**2020-233 Said-Alam:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for information related to "Event #16032448". MPD had denied the request because, "[a]bsent authorization from the victim, or proof of representation...[as] a release of such records would constitute...a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2A)(B)." The requestor provided a signed release in the appeal and the matter was remanded to MPD to promptly disclose the requested records.

**2020-234 Spindel:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of CFSA to a request for records concerning the Grandparent Caregiver Program." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the identification of a response that had been issued by CFSA.

**2020-235 Spindel:** The appeal challenged DHS's failure to respond to a request for contracts between DHS and community providers for housing prevention services. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DHS to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2020-236 Vining:** The appeal challenged EOM's failure to respond to a request for the names of persons who submitted applications for positions on the Historic Preservation Review Board over a two-year period, as well as the dates of those submissions. The appeal was denied as EOM's deadline to respond was tolled by the pending public health emergency.

**2020-239; 2020-240 Spindel:** The appeal challenged CFSA's failure to respond to a request for a breakdown of child homicides committed by parent or caregiver by each year, age of child, ward of child, and cause of death. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to CFSA to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2020-243 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DBH to a request seeking answers to a series of questions. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2020-244 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request referencing multiple news articles. MPD had referred the request to another agency. The appeal was denied because MPD properly responded to the request.

**2020-248 Sullivan:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCME to a request for records related to a specific death investigation. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OCME.

**2020-250 Calvert:** The appeal challenged the response of HSEMA to a request for records related to the requestor. HSEMA had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because HSEMA conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2020-254 Crocheron:** The appeal challenged the response of ORM to a request for records related to the requestor. ORM had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because ORM conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-002 Fassler:** The appeal challenged MPD's failure to respond to a request for a search of emails to or from a specific address containing specific terms. At the time of the appeal, the underlying request remained open. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to comply with 1 DCMR § 405.1 with the objective of producing any non-exempt records that are responsive to the request as soon as practical.

**2021-003 Black:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for a copy of body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-005 Fermo:** The appeal challenged the response of DOH to a request for information about a specific dog. DOH had denied the request citing the personal privacy exemption to FOIA, D.C.

Code § 2-534(a)(2). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to DOH's conduct as an agency.

**2021-006 Sullivan:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to the death of an individual. MPD had denied the request because the release of such records could interfere with a future proceeding by revealing the direction and pace of the investigation, and are therefore exempt from disclosure under D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied based on MPD's representation of an ongoing investigation involving a deceased individual.

**2021-008 Kerpen:** The appeal challenged the response of DDOT to a request for records related to a speed bump on Tennyson Street, NW. With respect to the appeal, DDOT had provided records redacting certain names and identifying information pursuant to the personal privacy exemption of FOIA, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to DDOT's conduct as an agency.

**2021-009 Anderson:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for information related to an anonymous phone call. MPD had referred the request to OUC. The appeal was denied because MPD properly responded to the request.

**2021-010 Spindel:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of CFSA to a request for contracts between CFSA and the D.C. Family Success Centers, as well as all submissions by the Success Centers regarding what services they will provide to D.C. residents. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by CFSA.

**2021-011 Anaya:** The appeal challenged the response of OUC to a request for audio and documents related to a specific incident. OUC had denied the request because it did not adequately describe the records sought. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OUC.

**2021-012 Cloar:** The appeal challenged the response of OTR to a multi-part request for information related to rental rates for retail properties, vacancy ratios for rental properties, expense ratios for retail properties, capitalization rates for retail properties, and reserves for retail properties. OTR had provided 143 pages of responsive documents but denied the remainder of the request because it was unduly burdensome and did not reasonably describe the records sought. The appeal was denied as OTR provided an adequate response given the request.

**2021-013 Zeh:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for documents related to a motor vehicle collision. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-015 Bell:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DDOT to a request for "[r]ecords about the timing of repaving 16th Street, N.W. between H and K Streets" and "[c]ommunications between the Department of Transportation and the Office of the Mayor about the repaving of the

southern end of Black Lives Matter Plaza in front of St. John's Church on August 11, 2020." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DDOT.

**2021-016 Flack:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for copies of emails to or from certain individuals that contained certain keywords. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-018 Freedman:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for audio and video related to a homicide. MPD had denied the request because the release of such records could interfere with a future proceeding by revealing the direction and pace of the investigation, and are therefore exempt from disclosure under D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied based on MPD's representation of an ongoing investigation involving a deceased individual.

**2021-020 Kabat:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for a copy of body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-022 Ippolito-Shepherd:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to a 911 call. MPD had referred the request to OUC. The appeal was denied because MPD properly responded to the request.

**2021-024 Grivnow:** The appeal challenged the response of DCPS to a request for records related to multiple grievances. DCPS had issued a prepayment invoice. The appeal was dismissed for a lack of jurisdiction; the MOLC's jurisdiction is limited to "review[ing] the public record to determine whether [a record] may be withheld from public inspection." D.C. Code § 2-537(a).

**2021-027 Anaya:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for information related to a specific motor vehicle accident. The appeal was denied because it did not contain a copy of the original response of MPD; this Office was unable to determine the adequacy of the response, or lack thereof.

**2021-029 Crocheron:** The appeal challenged the response of EOM to a request for records related to FBI checks. The appeal was denied as an improper request, i.e. only MPD may accept requests for body worn camera footage.

**2021-030 Crocheron:** The appeal challenged the response of DFHV to a request for motorcade information. DFHV had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because DFHV conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-033 Johnson:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for a specific incident report and charging information. MPD had made a referral to another agency, in part, and provided the documents it located subject to redactions made to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) to protect the privacy of certain MPD members, victims and witnesses. The appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search and properly responded to the request.

**2021-035 Thompson:** The appeal challenged the response of DOES to a request for "the database(s) used by DOES to keep track of information reported by all businesses on UC-30s."

DOES had denied the request, asserting that the records are exempt from disclosure in their entirety pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(6) (“Information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute...”). The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DOES to disclose the non-exempt portions of the records requested.

**2021-037 Bell:** The appeal challenged the response of DHCD to a request seeking answers to questions and records related to “the work, construction, and/or demolition which was accomplished and/or attempted on roads, sidewalks, and/or curbs in DC on D St NE between 19th St NE and Oklahoma Ave.” DHCD had issued a final response referring the request to DDOT and advising the requestor it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because DHCD conducted an adequate search and properly responded to the request.

**2021-045 Liu:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for body worn camera footage related to a specific traffic incident. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-046 Acharya:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for a copy of body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-047 Sparrow:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for a copy of body worn camera footage related to a case file. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-048 Bell:** The appeal challenged the response of OCP to a request for documents related to “the work, construction, and/or demolition which was accomplished and/or attempted on roads, sidewalks, and/or curbs in DC on D St NE between 19th St NE and Oklahoma Ave.” OCP had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records but additional information may provide better search results. The appeal was denied because OCP conducted an adequate search given the request.

**2021-049 Ghirma:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for a copy of body worn camera footage related to a specific traffic accident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-050 Galaska:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for a roster of all MPD officers containing specific information from 2010 to the present. MPD had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive documents containing the entirety of the requested information and referring the requestor to publicly available information (e.g. salaries). The appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search given the request.

**2021-052 Murray:** The appeal challenged the response of DFS to a request for photographs and documents related to a specific incident. DFS had denied the request, stating that responsive records were exempt from disclosure to protect personal privacy pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2) and D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(C). The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DFS to disclose the requested records subject to redaction.

**2021-053 Morris:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DDOT to a request for interview ranking scores. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DDOT.

**2021-054 Colbert:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DHCD to a request for a copy of surveillance footage at a specific location and time. The appeal was dismissed as moot following a review of responses issued by DHCD.

**2021-056 Raoufou:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for CCTV footage at a specific location and time. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD referring the request to HSEMA.

**2021-057 Raoufou:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DDOT to a request for CCTV footage at a specific location and time. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DDOT referring the request to HSEMA.

**2021-058 Nirappil:** The appeal challenged OSA's failure to respond to a request for identified emails and text messages. At the time of the appeal, the underlying request remained open. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OSA to comply with 1 DCMR § 405.1 with the objective of producing any non-exempt records that are responsive to the request as soon as practical.

**2021-062 Raoufou:** The appeal challenged the response of HSEMA to a request for CCTV footage at a specific location and time. HSEMA had granted the request in full but a different camera angle was sought. The appeal was denied because HSEMA conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-064 Stone:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOEE to a request for "reporting and inspection records for Superior Concrete Materials located at 1721 S Capitol St SW, Washington, DC." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOEE.

**2021-065 Culp:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for a motor vehicle accident report. MPD had granted the request in full. The appeal was denied as MPD provided an adequate response.

**2021-066 Nahas:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to three FOIA requests seeking a specific police report. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-067; 2021-068 Leopold:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for body-worn camera footage taken on January 6, 2021. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2),(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) based on MPD's representation that the footage was related to an ongoing criminal investigation.

**2021-069 Lange:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for radio transmissions related to January 6, 2021. MPD had denied the request because the release of such records could

interfere with a future proceeding by revealing the direction and pace of the investigation, and are therefore exempt from disclosure under D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied based on MPD's representation that the requested records were related to an ongoing investigation.

**2021-070 Bravin:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for body-worn and other photographs, recordings or reports related to January 6, 2021. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2),(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) based on MPD's representation that the records were related to an ongoing criminal investigation.

**2021-071 Sus:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to January 6, 2021. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2),(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) based on MPD's representation that the records were related to an ongoing criminal investigation.

**2021-072 Matheson:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DDOT to a request for a list of "any authorized emergency vehicle operated by a non DC Government entity, as well as qualifying criteria used by DDOT to authorize a[n] agency to operate a vehicle equipped with emergency lights and siren[s] within the District." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the correction of a typographical error in sending the response.

**2021-073 Light:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for a copy of a firearm/gun permit issued to an individual. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2) and (a)(3)(C). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2), (a)(3)(C) and (a)(6). D.C. § 2-534(a)(6) provides for the withholding of "information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute..." Under D.C. Code § 7-2502.11a, "Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked any [firearm] registration [certificate] issued pursuant to this subchapter shall not be made available as a public record under § 2-532." Similarly, D.C. Code § 7-2509.09 provides in pertinent part, "Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked a license shall not be made available as a public record under § 2-532..."

**2021-074 Light:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for body-worn camera footage taken on January 6, 2021. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2),(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) based on MPD's representation that the footage was related to an ongoing criminal investigation.

**2021-076 Krepp:** The appeal challenged the response of DDOT to a request for traffic data from a study of a specific area. DDOT had responded to the request withholding some documents pursuant to the deliberative process privilege, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(4). Following the appeal, additional documents were provided. The appeal was denied because DDOT conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-077 Maxwell:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-080 Krepp:** The appeal challenged the response of DMPED to a request for “all information that you and other DMPED and city employees have shared with ANC7F Commissioners in 2019 and 2020.” DMPED had provided an initial response and advised the requestor it continued to search for responsive documents. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded for DMPED to issue a final response upon the conclusion of the ongoing search.

**2021-081 Smith:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for records related to a specific investigation. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-083 Marshall:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to “an alleged 1993 sexual assault by then-Senator Joseph R. Biden against aide Tara Reade...” MPD had provided a copy of an incident report. The appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search given the request received.

**2021-084 Orecchio-Egresitz:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for the applications/paperwork filled out by specified individuals during the process of obtaining a firearms registration certificate or concealed carry license. MPD had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2), (a)(3)(C) and (a)(6). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(6). D.C. § 2-534(a)(6) provides for the withholding of “information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute...” Under D.C. Code § 7-2502.11a, “Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked any [firearm] registration [certificate] issued pursuant to this subchapter shall not be made available as a public record under § 2-532.” Similarly, D.C. Code § 7-2509.09 provides in pertinent part, “Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked a license shall not be made available as a public record under § 2-532...”

**2021-085 Ciola:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. MPD had closed the request as a duplicate without providing a response. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-089 Tau:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for rap sheets and other investigative records related to the requestor. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to comply with 1 DCMR § 405.1 with the objective of producing any non-exempt records that are responsive to the request as soon as practical.

**2021-095 Zumbar:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for records related to a specific investigation. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-105 Hanlon:** The appeal challenged OANC’s failure to respond to a request for communications between named individuals and anyone at DDOT related to the possible



installation of one or more protected bike lanes on 17th Street, North of Massachusetts Avenue. OANC had closed the request as abandoned following a request to clarify the search terms. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OANC to promptly conduct a search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-108 Flippin:** The appeal challenged the response of DCHR to a request seeking the verification of employment for an individual with a questionnaire. DCHR had provided a link to a responsive document but explained the agency has no duty to answer questions. The appeal was denied because DCHR had properly responded to the request; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2021-113 Cawood:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of FEMS to a request for a specific Fire Marshall's report. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by FEMS.

**2021-117 Coles:** The appeal challenged OCA's failure to respond to a request for documents related to meetings and communications of certain individuals. OCA had advised the requestor it was still processing the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OCA to promptly conduct a search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-119 Lehmkuhl:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for records related to a specific speed camera infraction. The appeal was dismissed as moot following MPD's referral of the matter to another agency.

**2021-121 Fakri:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of FEMS to a request for records related to a fire incident report for a specific address. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by FEMS.

**2021-122 Smith:** The appeal challenged the response of DFS to a request for information related to the recovery of firearms. DFS had responded to the request stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because DFS had properly responded to the request; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to create records.

**2021-123 Gomez:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for records related to a Mayoral stay-at-home order. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-129 Bell:** The appeal challenged the response of DDOT to a request for "[r]ecords, including emails and text messages, between DDOT and the Executive Office of the Mayor about Black Lives Matter Plaza." DDOT had responded to the request by providing some records and withholding other records pursuant to the deliberative-process privilege, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(4). The appeal was granted, in part, and remanded back to DDOT with instructions to produce scheduling emails. DDOT's decision to withhold briefing or draft documents that discuss recommendations or proposals was affirmed.

**2021-130; 2021-131 Bangs:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to two requests for specific reports and database records. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to promptly conduct a search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-133 Bangs:** The appeal challenged the response of DOES to a request for records related to the Tipped Wage Program and audits conducted by the Office of Wage-Hour. DOES had responded by stating that it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was granted, in part, and remanded back to DOES to provide a response to records related to any audit initiated by the agency. The remainder of the appeal was denied because DOES conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-137 Boston:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DDOT to a request for records related to tree planting. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DDOT.

**2021-139 Light:** The appeal challenged the response of OUC to a request for “Background Event Chronology for any 911 calls or radio runs for the time period of 12 Noon eastern to 9 pm eastern relating to events at the US Capitol [on January 6, 2021]”. OUC had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) based on OUC’s representation that the calls were related to an ongoing criminal investigation.

**2021-140 Williams:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOES to a request for all documents related to a specific workers’ compensation case. DOES subsequently responded by providing the responsive records identified and stating it was unable to perform a full onsite search because of the public health emergency. The appeal was dismissed as moot, in part, given the response of DOES. The appeal was granted, in part, and the matter was remanded back to DOES to conduct a physical search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-141 Cochran:** The appeal challenged the response of DOC to a request for all police reports and arrest records for a named individual. DOC had denied the request and referred it to MPD. The appeal was denied because DOC properly responded to the request.

**2021-144 Copeland:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for body worn camera footage related to a specific incident. MPD had denied the request a release of such records would constitute as a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and is exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534 (a)(2) and (a)(3)(C). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested documents would be relevant to MPD’s conduct as an agency.

**2021-145 Wyatt:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DCRA to a request for records related to a specific company. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DCRA.

**2021-146 Anaya:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to a specific traffic accident. MPD had provided a copy of the crash report maintained in its record

management system. The appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-147 Smith:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for “[c]opies of any and all records related to sexual assault complaints, including but not limited to incident reports, generated by [MPD] in November 1971.” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-148 Cloar:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCTO to a request for “the inputs and processes used by OTR to produce the Tax Year 2022 real property tax assessments for commercial office buildings.” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OTR.

**2021-149 Forte:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for body worn camera footage related to a specific motor vehicle accident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-153 Mulhauser:** The appeal challenged DME’s failure to respond to a request for “any records about an evaluation of education in the District being done by Mathematica.” The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DME to promptly conduct a search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-156 Johnson:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for a 2003 missing person report. MPD had issued a response stating it did not have any responsive records. MPD also noted that under its record retention schedule, missing persons reports “have a retention period of two (2) years within MPD, for a total of ten (10) years.” The appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-158 Lazar:** The appeal challenged the response of OCFO to a request for “the District’s outstanding check listing.” OCFO had granted the request by providing an Excel spreadsheet which included a listing of checks, the amount of the check and the owner’s name and address. The appeal was denied because it did not contain a copy of the original request and there was an ambiguity as to what was originally sought.

**2021-162 Mulhauser:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for a copy of any report on police conduct in kettling, arresting, transporting and processing of demonstrators in June 2020 in the area of Swann Street, NW. At the time of the appeal, the underlying request remained open. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to comply with 1 DCMR § 405.1 with the objective of producing any non-exempt records that are responsive to the request as soon as practical.

**2021-163 Anaya:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for information related to a specific motor vehicle accident. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-164 Simon:** The appeal challenged the response of DHCD to a request for “all information and paperwork including the DHCD stamped paperwork for the 714 Park Road NW Tenants

Association, Inc.” The issue on appeal was that DHCD had produced responsive records that had not been stamped as “received” due to the pandemic. The appeal was denied because an agency does not have a duty to create documents.

**2021-165 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for public records related to certain individuals and a specific address. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-166 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of EOM to a request for public records related to certain individuals and two specific addresses. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by EOM.

**2021-167 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of EOM to a request for “any and all emails received from or sent to any email address that includes the characters: policeabuse.com.” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by EOM.

**2021-168 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of EOM to a request for “any and all emails received from or sent to any email address that includes the characters: policeabuse.com.” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by EOM.

**2021-174 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCTO to a request for any and all emails sent to or received from specific email addresses. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OCTO.

**2021-175 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCTO to a request for any and all emails sent to or received from any email address containing the characters “policeabuse.com.” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OCTO.

**2021-177 Montares Silva:** The appeal challenged the response of DFHV to a request for “information about the costs of the system and service(s) that DFHV uses for receiving, processing and analyzing data from the taxi and limousine industry and the TNC (ridehailing) companies operating in Washington DC.” DFHV had responded that it did not have any responsive records and referred the requestor to OCP. The appeal was denied because DFHV conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2021-181 Marshall:** The appeal challenged the response of EOM to a request for “communications between Mayor’s Office Communications Director...and other city, state and federal government officials regarding Brian Sicknick.” EOM had referred the request to OCA as the agency having access to the records. The appeal was denied because EOM properly responded to the request.

**2021-197 Rosenthal:** The appeal challenged the failure of DCPS to respond to a request for various records related to a comprehension review of IMPACT, a performance evaluation system for teachers. At the time of the appeal, the underlying request remained open. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DCPS to produce the requested records on a rolling basis.

**2021-213 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DCRA to a request for records related to a number of specific addresses, email addresses, and policies and procedures for determining the status of buildings. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DCRA.

**2021-215 Slate:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOES to a request for records related to the requestor and other policies and procedures. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOES.

**2021-218 Schaffer:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of MPD to a request for the emails of listed persons containing specific key words. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by MPD.

**2021-222 Davis:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request for a “list of all licensed individuals and companies for the following license categories: home improvement contractor, home improvement salesperson and general contractor.” DCRA had provided responsive documents and assisted the requestor in accessing the publicly available data. The appeal was denied because DCRA had properly responded to the request; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to create records.

**2021-225 Bangs:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCP to a request for records about two specific contracts. OCP had initially issued a prepayment invoice, which was later waived. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OCP.

**2021-228 Faniyi:** The appeal challenged the response of CFSA to a request for documents related to the requestor’s children. CFSA had denied the request, asserting that the records are exempt from disclosure in their entirety pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(6)(“Information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute...”; D.C. Code §§ 4-1302.03 and 4-1303.06 expressly limits to whom and for what purpose the agency may disclose information of the nature requested). The appeal was denied and the requestor was instructed as to a separate process to obtain the requested information.

**2021-230 Kinney:** The appeal challenged the response of DCPL to a request for records related to the award of a contract. DCPL had denied the request in the absence of an advance payment of the processing fee. The appeal was denied for a lack of jurisdiction.

**2021-232 Austermuhle:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for “the results of any polls or surveys conducted and/or produced by Elucd as part of its contract with MPD for its Community Sentiment Survey Tool platform...”, “the results of any other public surveys or polls conducted by or for MPD in the [November 13, 2019 to May 28, 2021] time frame”, and “any and all emails, letters, memos, and other correspondence within MPD and to outside parties and agencies including the words ‘Babuk,’ ‘hack,’ ‘ransom,’ and ‘ransomware.’” The appeal was dismissed as moot, in part, and granted, in part, and the matter was remanded back to MPD to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-237 Hanlon:** The appeal challenged OANC’s failure to respond to a request for copies of every email and text messages exchanged between named ANC 2B Commissioners and six

identified individuals. At the time of the appeal, OANC continued to process the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OANC to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-238 Hanlon:** The appeal challenged OANC's failure to respond to a request for email, texts and video related to meetings held during a specific period. At the time of the appeal, OANC continued to process the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OANC to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-239 Hanlon:** The appeal challenged OANC's failure to respond to a request for email and text message exchanged between the Chair of ANC 2B and four named individuals. At the time of the appeal, OANC continued to process the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OANC to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-240 Khatri:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of UDC to a request for various personnel and program records. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by UDC.

**2021-243 Barber:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OAH to a request for "all matters, materials, and inquiries taken up responses by OAH Ethics committee since 2014 involving: 1. Administrative Law Judges ("ALJs") and mediation; and 2. ALJs representing immediate family." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OAH.

**2021-244 Donahue:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OANC to a request for a copy of an ANC 8A meeting held by zoom. The appeal was denied following the issuance of a response by OANC stating that it did not have any responsive records and had not received a request for assistance from the ANC.

**2021-245 Faniyi:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of FEMS to a request for records related to the medical treatment of the requestor's children. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by FEMS.

**2021-249 Barber:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OAH to a request for all communications between two individuals about the requestor for a specific time period. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OAH.

**2021-256 Carstens:** The appeal challenged OTR's response to a request for copies of "individual income tax audit documents and files relating to [2 clients] for tax years 2011, 2015 and 2016." OTR had denied the request as overbroad. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OTR to conduct a search for responsive records.

**2021-257 Spindel:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of CFSA to a request for "[T]he number of referrals from CFSA to Youth Division each calendar year 2018-2020 and to date 2021, and how many are TOT'd and the reasons for same." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by CFSA.

**2021-260 Jablow:** The appeal challenged DOEE’s response to a request for records related to R Street SE, in Washington, D.C. DOEE had advised the requestor it continued to process the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DOEE to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2021-262 Araujo:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DHCD to a request for records related to a specific address. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DHCD.

**2021-264 Marshall:** The appeal challenged the response of OCME to a request for “[a]ll records, including but not limited to autopsy reports, toxicology reports, notes, photographs, and OCME officials' electronic communications, related to the [specific] deaths on Jan. 6, 2021...” OCME had provided records which had been redacted pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(2). OCME would further assert the requested records, in part or whole, were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) and (a)(6)(citing D.C. Code § 5-1412). The appeal was denied as the exemptions asserted by OCME were appropriate.

**2021-265 Seyoum:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of UDC to a request for specific employment announcements and communications between the Middle States Commission of Higher Education and UDC. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DHCD.

**2021-266 Daniels:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DCHA to a request for records related to a specific redevelopment plan. The appeal was dismissed due to an insufficiency in the submission of the request.

**2022-006 Cochran:** The appeal challenged the response of OCFO to a request for “the most recent unclaimed outstanding checks/warrants including the A/R Credits, Payroll, and AP issued by the Agencies/Departments.” OCFO had denied the request, asserting that the records are exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(6)(“Information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute...”; specifically, Section 7083 the permanent Revised Uniform Unclaimed Property Act of 2021). The appeal was denied as the cited exemption was appropriate.

**2022-008 Becker:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCFO to a request for the last six years of Treasurer Investment reports and related information. OCFO had initially denied the request but subsequently provided available documents. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OCFO.

**2022-010 Suntoso:** The appeal challenged the response of DOES to a request for all “Alien Employment Certification-related documents” related to a specific individual. DOES had stated that it did not have any responsive records and referred the requestor to the Department of Labor. The appeal was denied because DOES properly responded to the request.

**2022-011 Seegars:** The appeal challenged MPD’s failure to respond to a request for body worn camera footage taken at a specific time and location. MPD had initially denied the request absent an authorization but continued to work with the requestor to process the request. The appeal was dismissed as moot based on MPD’s representation that it continued to process the request.

**2022-014 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DBH to a request seeking documents unrelated to the work of the agency and also answers to a series of questions. DBH had denied the request stating that it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2022-015 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCHR to a request seeking documents unrelated to the work of the agency and also answers to a series of questions. DCHR had denied the request stating that it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2022-016 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request seeking documents unrelated to the work of the agency and also answers to a series of questions. DCRA had denied the request stating that it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2022-018 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCPS to a request seeking documents unrelated to the work of the agency and also answers to a series of questions. DCPS had provided a link to some information and referred the requestor to DCHR. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2022-019 Ayele:** The appeal challenged the response of DCPL to a request seeking documents unrelated to the work of the agency and also answers to a series of questions. DCPL had denied the request stating that it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because the request did not adequately describe the records sought; under FOIA, an agency does not have a duty to answer questions.

**2022-026 Strauss:** The appeal challenged the response of DCHD to a request for “all documents, including but not limited to, TOPA notice, Tenant Association Registration, By-laws, Letter of Interest in Purchase, for the property located at 3132 16th Street NW, Washington DC 20010.” DCHD had provided a copy of responsive documents and asserted certain documents were exempt from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA personal privacy exemption, D.C. Code §2-534(a)(2). The appeal was denied because the cited privacy interest (personal information of tenants) was not outweighed by any public interest in disclosure; it was unclear how disclosing the requested information would be relevant to DHCD’s conduct as an agency.

**2022-028 Andrews:** The appeal challenged the response of OUC to a request for extensive policy and protocol information. OUC had provided some documents and generally described the search performed. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OUC to conduct an adequate search and disclose any non-exempt records.



**2022-031 DeVille:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DISB to a request for all records related to an investigation of an insurance matter involving a driver insured by Nationwide. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DISB

**2022-032 Smith:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for records related to a homicide investigation. MPD had denied the request because the release of such records could interfere with a future proceeding by revealing the direction and pace of the investigation, and are therefore exempt from disclosure under D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was denied based on MPD's representation of an ongoing investigation involving an unsolved homicide.

**2022-033 Khatri:** The appeal challenged the response of UDC to a multi-part request seeking various records, including resumes and transcripts of specific faculty members. UDC had provided a copy of responsive documents and asserted certain documents (resumes and transcripts) were exempt from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA personal privacy exemption, D.C. Code §2-534(a)(2). The matter was remanded to UDC to provide a more detailed explanation of the privacy interest in transcripts with personal information redacted.

**2022-035 Abdelhady:** The appeal challenged the response of DOES to a request for "records of all filings, notices, correspondence, and any other records pertaining to assessments by the DOES, or payments to the DOES, of, by, or for The George Washington University as a self-insured employer pursuant to D.C. Code 32-1540 and/or DC Code 32-1541." DOES had advised the requestor it had trouble transferring documents and sought to submit an OCTO search. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DOES to conduct an adequate search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2022-037 Stone:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOEE to a request for "all RCRA records related to National Engineering Products, Inc. located at 1950 Capitol Avenue NE, DC." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOEE.

**2022-040 Williams:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOEE to a request for records related to a specified workers' compensation file. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOEE.

**2022-041 Abdelhady:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOES to a request seeking: 1) records retention policies or directives in effect at any time between January 1, 2015 and November 20, 2021; and 2) "records indicating the name(s) of the DOES' "records management officer" or equivalent who was/were designated by the DOES as required by D.C. Code § 2-1706(b)(3), or any other applicable law, and acting as "records management officer" at any time between January 1, 2015 and November 20, 2021." The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOES.

**2022-042 Mondragon:** The appeal challenged the response of OANC to a request for a multi-part request for records related to ANC 5B. OANC had challenged the adequacy of the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OANC to conduct an adequate search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2022-044 Nelson:** The appeal challenged the response of DOH to a request asking questions and seeking documents related to a health facility. DOH had responded to the request stating that it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied because DOH conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-046 Errichetti:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request for a specific building plan. DCRA had provided responsive documents and a link to access publicly available information. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DCRA to conduct an adequate search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2022-053 Schloss:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request for “a record of all currently active licensees who practice the trades of Electrician, Plumber, and Refrigeration/Air Conditioner Mechanic.” DCRA had responded to the request by providing a link to publicly available information. The appeal was denied because DCRA conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-056 Williams:** The appeal challenged the response of DOES to a request for records related to a specific workers’ compensation claim. DOES had provided a copy of responsive documents that the requestor asserted to be incomplete. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DOES to provide a detailed explanation of the search conducted.

**2022-058 Hedrick:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of UDC to a request for “any records, including emails, documents, memos, video, [and] photographs...” related to the requestor. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by UDC.

**2022-071 Balasubramanian:** The appeal challenged the response of DOH to a request seeking “emails, phone call transcripts, or meeting transcripts or other written materials from Dr. LaQuandra S. Nesbitt, Mr. Brian W. Amy, [or] any of their predecessors and subordinates... discussing the timely production, delayed production, or non-production of the District of Columbia Trauma Registry in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021.” DOH had responded to the request stating it did not have any responsive records. The appeal was denied because DOH conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-072 Mason:** The appeal challenged the response of OHR to a request for records related to a specific OHR file involving the requestor. OHR had denied the request pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(6)(A) and (a)(3)(A)-(B). The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to OHR to disclose the non-exempt portions of the responsive records.

**2022-085 McCray:** The appeal challenged the response of EOM to a request for “the identity of the individual and or the federal agency that issued the ‘permits’ to the demonstrators [referenced in Mayor’s Order 2021-002].” EOM had issued a final response referring the requestor to a federal agency and advising the requestor it did not have any responsive documents. The appeal was denied as EOM properly responded to the request.

**2022-088 Conforti:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request seeking “all building permits to construct a fence or any other structure on the property located at 2899 Audubon Terrace, NW.” DCRA had responded by providing a copy of the responsive records

identified and a link to publicly available information. The appeal was denied because DCRA conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-089 Davies:** The appeal challenged the response of DOC to a request for “[a]ny documents from the U.S. Marshals Service [(“USMS”)]in possession of the Department of Corrections, documenting conditions in the jail, observations at the jail or any suggestions or recommendations for addressing or remediating conditions identified by [USMS].” DOC had responded to the request stating it was withholding responsive documents pursuant to the deliberative process privilege, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(4). The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded to DOC to promptly review the withheld report and disclose any non-exempt portions or provide an explanation of why there is no reasonably segregable material.

**2022-090 Walton:** The appeal challenged the response of CAH to a multi-part request for documents related to specific grant awards. CAH had issued a response providing a copy of the responsive records it identified. The appeal was denied as CAH properly responded to the request.

**2022-095 Becker:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OCFO to a request for “[t]he last [six] complete Investment Advisory Committee Investment Reports.” OCFO had responded stating that it did not have any responsive documents. Following the appeal, OCFO agreed to conduct a further search and produce any documents identified. The appeal was dismissed as moot given the response of OCFO.

**2022-097 Howe-Goldstein:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of OUC to a request for records related to a specific call. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by OUC.

**2022-099 Ewall:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DPW to a request for records related to “Life Cycle Analysis.” DPW had asked for clarification of the request. The appeal was dismissed and the requestor was encouraged to clarify the request with DPW for additional processing.

**2022-101 Konigsburg:** The appeal challenged EOM’s failure to respond to a request seeking “all records for [Ivy City] in respect to Lewis Crowe Park at West Virginia and Mt. Olivet and Capitol Ave. NE.” The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to EOM to promptly disclose any non-exempt records.

**2022-110 Konigsburg:** The appeal challenged the response of DHS to a request for information about services provided in Ivy City. DHS had denied the request for a lack of specificity. The appeal was denied as DHS properly responded to the request.

**2022-112 Konigsburg:** The appeal challenged the response of OCTO to a request for the emails of an MPD employee. OCTO had responded by referring the request to MPD. The appeal was denied as OCTO properly responded to the request.

**2022-120 Mendez:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for footage from an incident involving the requestor and four offices at a specific location and date. MPD had issued a final response stating it did not have any responsive records because they had been purged. The

appeal was denied because MPD conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-130 Phillips:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOC to a multi-part request, in part, related to visitor lockers. DOC had provided a partial response and requested clarification on a portion of the request. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded to DOC to perform an adequate search and disclose any non-exempt records.

**2022-131 Dickson:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DPW to a request for “[a]ny information regarding parking enforcement on the 4400 block of C street SE, including any correspondence from [named individuals] on the matter” The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DPW.

**2022-134 Servoss:** The appeal challenged the response of OUC to a request for 911 calls made as the result of a burglary in progress at a specific location and time. OUC had denied the request because the records sought were exempt from disclosure pursuant to D.C. Code §§ 2-534(a)(2),(a)(3)(C), and (a)(3)(A)(i). The appeal was granted, in part, and remanded, in part, for OUC to disclose the requestor’s own 911 call.

**2022-151 Louria:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DPR to a request for emails sent to or received from specific employees and containing specific keywords. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DPR.

**2022-170 McFarland:** The appeal challenged the response of DCRA to a request for communications between an individual and employees that he interviewed. DCRA had provided responsive documents with redactions. The appeal was denied because DCRA conducted an adequate search in response to the request for records.

**2022-176 Stonebarger:** The appeal challenged the response of MPD to a request for any and all reports generated as the result of an investigation into the death of an individual. MPD had provided a copy of an incident report and referred the requestor to other agencies. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to MPD to explain in greater detail the steps it took in searching for the responsive documents.

**2022-180 Mooney:** The appeal challenged the response of OIG to a request for records related to the requestor. OIG had denied the request pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(3)(A)(i) which exempts from disclosure investigatory records pertaining to ongoing criminal and administrative matters because premature public disclosure would interfere with pending or prospective enforcement proceedings. The appeal was denied based on OIG’s representation of an ongoing investigation.

**2022-192 Crowell:** The appeal challenged the response of DDOT to a request for records related to a bicycle lane project on Arizona Ave., NW in Washington, D.C. DDOT had provided responsive documents that had been redacted, or withheld in their entirety, pursuant to the deliberative process exemption, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(4) and the personal privacy exemption, D.C. Code § 2-534(a)(4), of FOIA. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to DDOT to conduct an adequate search and perform a segregability analysis.

**2022-193 Crowell:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of EOM to a request for records related to a bicycle lane project on Arizona Ave., NW in Washington, D.C. EOM had asked the requestor to clarify the request which was provided. The appeal was granted and the matter was remanded back to EOM to conduct an adequate search and produce any non-exempt records identified.

**2022-196 Rabieh:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DOES to a multi-part request for agency emails. The appeal was dismissed as moot following the confirmation of a response by DOES.

**2022-209 Bromberg:** The appeal challenged the lack of response of DMHHS to a request for all correspondence regarding Burke Park and Gompers park. At the time of the appeal, the underlying request remained open. The appeal was dismissed after DMHHS advised this Office it would conduct a search and produce any non-exempt records as soon as practical.
