Dear Chairman Mendelson and Chairperson McDuffie:

In accordance with the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act<sup>1</sup> (D.C. FOIA), enclosed is the annual report of the FOIA disclosure activities of each "public body" (agency) of the D.C. government for the most recent fiscal year.

This report covers the period of October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2013 and contains data responsive to the annual reporting required by the FOIA to the extent available. To the extent that a public body does not report to the Mayor, information pertaining to that body may not be reflected in this report.

This report includes the following:

1. The number of FOIA requests received and the number of requests completed<sup>2</sup>;
2. The number of requests for records that had not yet been completed by September 30, 2013;
3. The average number of days that unfilled requests have been pending before each public body as of September 30, 2013 (i.e. of the incomplete requests, how long had they been waiting for a response);
